<a href="#">1.3.1</a>	Info and Relationships	A	Ensure content, instructions, labels, etc are written in a way that the relationship between information and structure is conveyed on different displays (including screen readers)
<a href="#">1.3.2</a>	Meaningful Sequence	A	Present content in a meaningful reading order (does not need to be linear)
<a href="#">1.3.3</a>	Sensory Characteristics	A	Use more than one sense for instructions for those who may not be able to perceive shape, size or orientation
<a href="#">2.4.2</a>	Page Titled	A	Use helpful, relevant and clear page titles
<a href="#">2.4.4</a>	Link Purpose (In Context)	A	Use clear, concise labelling to describe the purpose of each link
<a href="#">2.4.6</a>	Headings and Labels	AA	Use clear and descriptive headings and labels
<a href="#">2.4.9</a>	Link Purpose (Link Only)	AAA	Every link's purpose is clear from its text. If destination the same use same description. Links with different purposes can use different descriptions
<a href="#">2.4.10</a>	Section Headings	AAA	Break up content with headings for better organisation of sections
<a href="#">3.1.3</a>	Unusual words	AAA	Explain any figurative or specialised words (provide an explanation or even link to a glossary)
<a href="#">3.1.4</a>	Abbreviations	AAA	Explain any abbreviations. Offer expanded form of abbreviations
<a href="#">3.1.5</a>	Reading Level	AAA	Ensure those with reading difficulties can comprehend content - equivalent to that of a 9 year old's comprehension level.
<a href="#">3.1.6</a>	Pronunciation	AAA	Explain any words that are hard to pronounce where they are required to understand content
<a href="#">3.3.2</a>	Labels or Instructions	A	Label form elements clearly and give instructions
<a href="#">3.3.3</a>	Error Suggestion	AA	Provide clear form correction instructions when users make errors

<a href="#">1.1.1</a>	Non-text Content	A	Provide text alternatives for non-text content - ALT tags, captions, descriptions
<a href="#">1.4.5</a>	Images of Text	AA	Don't use images of text
<a href="#">1.4.9</a>	Images of Text (No Exception)	AAA	Don't use images of text - No exceptions except for Brand Logos

No.	Guideline	Level	Summary
<a href="#">1.2.1</a>	Audio-only and Video-only (Pre-recorded)	A	Provide alternative equivalent information to video-only and audio-only content
<a href="#">1.2.2</a>	Captions (Pre-recorded)	A	Provide captions for all videos with audio content
<a href="#">1.2.3</a>	Audio Description or Media Alternative (Pre-recorded)	A	Video with audio has a second alternative equivalent description
<a href="#">1.2.4</a>	Captions (Live)	AA	Live videos have captions provided for all audio content
<a href="#">1.2.5</a>	Audio Description (Pre-recorded)	AA	Users have access to audio description for video content
<a href="#">1.2.6</a>	Sign Language (Pre-recorded)	AAA	Provide sign language translations for videos
<a href="#">1.2.7</a>	Extended Audio Description (Pre-recorded)	AAA	Provide extended audio description for videos where pauses in foreground audio are insufficient to convey sense of the video
<a href="#">1.2.8</a>	Media Alternative (Pre-recorded)	AAA	Provide a text alternative to videos
<a href="#">1.4.7</a>	Low or No Background Audio	AAA	Audio is clear for listeners to hear
<a href="#">2.3.1</a>	Three Flashes or Below	AAA	No content flashes more than three times per second

No.	Guideline	Level	Summary
<a href="#">1.4.1</a>	Use of Colour	A	Don't use presentation of information, categorisation or an action that relies solely on colour
<a href="#">1.4.3</a>	Contrast (Minimum)	AA	Contrast ratio between text (including images of text) and background is at least 4.5:1
<a href="#">1.4.6</a>	Contrast (Enhanced)	AAA	Contrast ratio between text (including images of text) and background is at least 7:1
<a href="#">1.4.11</a>	Non-Text Contrast	AA	Extend color contrast of at least 3:1 to non-text content such as infographics, diagrams, element states, etc.
<a href="#">3.2.4</a>	Consistent Identification	AA	Use icons, wayfinding elements and buttons consistently

<a href="#">1.3.1 (H51)</a>	Info and Relationships (Using table markup to present tabular information)	A	Use table markup (<table>) to present tabular data
<a href="#">1.3.1 (H39)</a>	Info and Relationships (Using caption elements to associate data table captions with data tables)	A	Use captions to identify tables
<a href="#">1.3.1 (H63)</a>	Info and Relationships (Using the scope attribute to associate header cells and data cells in data tables)	A	Use the scope attribute to associate header cells & data cells
<a href="#">1.3.1 (H73)</a>	Info and Relationships (Using the summary attribute of the table element to give an overview of data tables)	A	Use the summary attribute of the table element to give an overview of data tables
